My name is Lori Irwin and I am a faculty member in the Recreation, Parks and Leisure Services Department. I am writing to inform you of an event production assignment that is required of students enrolled in RPL 430: Planning Recreation Programs and Events and am asking for your support in their participation.

Working in small teams, students are required to create, design, and produce a public program or event including the responsibility for all budgeting, sponsorship, marketing, risk management, animation, staffing and evaluation. Students are required to either partner with a community agency or donate proceeds to charity. This assignment requires that students not only work within class time, but also to meet as a team outside of class hours and to produce their event outside of class hours. Each team's event is unique to their chosen mission, goals, objectives and target audience. Therefore, production event dates and times will vary depending logistic of event specifics.
